



# PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

As we move into the second half of the school year, I am excited to share our progress and focus on the last of our Education Goals for the 2024/2025 school year: Goal 5: 21st Century Learning/Workforce Preparation. Our primary outcome for this goal is to enhance real-world preparedness for our students. We believe that equipping students with practical skills and knowledge is essential for their future success.

**1. Revamping Adulting Day:** This year, we are transforming Adulting Day to focus on bringing in more professionals from various industries, especially the trades. These experts will share their experiences and expectations, providing students with valuable insights into the realities of different career paths. This day was previously scheduled for the end of January when final exams were completed for high school students. We found very few high school students came back to the school on a non-assigned day to attend sessions, so the date will be pushed to later in semester 2. If you have an idea of a presenter we could bring in, or if you would like to lead a session, please email me at [erikdani@sperd.ca](mailto:erikdani@sperd.ca).

**2. Intergenerational Collaboration:** We are hoping to introduce sessions that prepare students to work effectively with individuals from different generations. Understanding and appreciating generational differences is crucial in today's diverse workforce.

**3. Active Economics Education:** Our staff have recognized the need for students to become more knowledgeable around financial outcomes. CALM 20 contains outcomes with a financial focus. However, this single course is not enough to teach students what they need to know about budgeting and managing their money in a responsible way. The staff is discussing ways to integrate economics education into other courses.

**4. School Store:** We are discussing plans to launch a school store where students can sell products they create in their CTF and CTS classes and during their own time. This will not only teach entrepreneurial skills but also provide a platform for students to showcase their creativity and hard work. The school store will offer paid positions for students to manage the store after school hours, giving them real-world work experience as well. Stay tuned for more details!

**5. "Adulting 101" Course:** In semester 1, NMS introduced a new Grade 12 option called "Adulting 101." This course covered essential life skills such as budgeting, cooking, job searching, changing a tire, shutting off the water in your house, and more. The goal was to ensure that students left high school with some practical knowledge needed to navigate adulthood successfully. Students earned 3 CTS credits as Special Projects. The course was so successful principals in other schools within St. Paul Education requested course information. It will be offered again in September 2025.

**6. Skills Canada Programs:** NMS students from grade 7-9 participated in the Skills Canada Exploration Day in December, 2024. The program gave students the opportunity to explore in a hands-on environment and develop practical skills.

Students will be attending Try A Trade in Lloydminster on April 30. This exposure can help students make informed career choices and appreciate the value of skilled trades.

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The team at NMS is committed to providing all students with the tools and experiences they need to thrive in the real world. By focusing on these strategies, we aim to create a learning environment that prepares our students for the challenges and opportunities of the 21st century.

Provincial Achievement Tests (PATs) are scheduled for May and June 2025. PATs are expected to be written by all grade 6 and 9 students. These tests are created with the assistance of teachers across the province and provide valuable insights into your child's academic progress and understanding of the curriculum. Teachers may use the PAT as their in class final exam mark. It is a valuable piece of evidence of learning providing students with practice in that style of exam before their diploma. Additionally, the results contribute to the overall assessment of our school's performance and help inform our teaching practices.

More information on PATs from Alberta Education can be found on the embedded links for [grade 6](#) and [grade 9](#). This [link](#) is for a general bulletin for PATs. Exam dates for the 2024-2025 school year are provided below. These exams are secure. The school does not have flexibility to have students write them on alternate dates. It is important to plan family travel plans and events around exam dates so students have time to study, get a good night's rest the night before an exam, and are not rushed the day of the exam.


### Virtual field trips:





SafeArrival is an absence reporting system. Beginning, Tuesday, September 3, families can report an absence in three different ways that is most convenient for you using SafeArrival. ## SchoolMessenger App (Free)

Using your mobile device, download and install the "SM Home" app (NOT 'SchoolMessenger' app) from the Apple or Google Play Stores: [home.schoolmessenger.ca](http://home.schoolmessenger.ca). Sign in to create an account using your email address we have on file at your child's school. Select attendance. ## Online

Go to [home.schoolmessenger.ca](http://home.schoolmessenger.ca). Sign in or create an account using your email address that we have on file at your child's school and report your absence. Contact your school if you need to update your email address.

## By Phone

Call the toll-free number 1-844-502-5088 to report an absence using the automated phone system and follow the prompts.

If your student is marked absent and the absence hasn't been explained in advance, our new SafeArrival system will be able to rapidly contact you by automated phone call, text message, email, or mobile app push notification to ensure your child's safety.

# HOW SICK IS TOO SICK FOR SCHOOL?



## SEND TO SCHOOL

- A runny nose or just a little cough but no other symptoms.
- Sore throat but no other symptoms.
- No fever in the past 24 hours without fever-reducing medicine.
- No vomiting or diarrhea for 24 hours.



## KEEP AT HOME

- Fever higher than 100.4 degrees F (38 degrees C).
- Sore throat, with other symptoms such as a persistent cough.
- Vomiting or diarrhea in the past 24 hours.
- Eyes are pink and crusty.
- Has been exposed to an illness where isolation is recommended.

## SchoolMessenger Mass Notifications System Information for Parents



### What is SchoolMessenger?

SchoolMessenger is a mass notification system used to deliver information to families. These mass notifications are referred to as 'Broadcasts' due to SchoolMessenger's capability to simultaneously send messages to a vast number of destinations. Available broadcast destinations include phone, email, and SMS text.

Message recipients' contact data for parents comes from the PowerSchool Student Information System (SIS) database. This data is updated every evening so that any changes to phone numbers, emails and contact preferences will be current on every broadcast.

During phase one of implementation, the Division will begin using SchoolMessenger to communicate information to parents and guardians about safety alerts and school closures. Schools may also use this tool to share newsletters and information about special events and activities. Phase two, which includes activating the attendance reporting feature 'Safe Arrival', is expected to begin in early 2024.



### Phone Messages

- Phone calls will be reserved for emergencies such as safety alerts or early dismissal due to inclement weather.
- Phone calls will be sent as an automated message (computerized or human voice) and will come from the school phone number.
- In addition to a phone call, text and email messages will also be sent in emergency situations.



### Text Messages

- In addition to being used for emergencies, your school may also use text messages to communicate important information regarding sports and other after-school activities, field trip delays, etc.
- Under federal law originally designed to protect consumers from telemarketers, we have to get your permission to send messages to a mobile phone by SMS text. It is also just a good idea so that we're sure that message is going to the right phone number for the right person. Therefore, to receive texts you will need to opt-in.
- On **October 18, 2023** an opt-in invitation text to participate in this free service\* will be sent to mobile phone numbers of all primary contacts uploaded from our Student Information System (SIS). Recipients have to reply "y" or "yes" to the invitation text message to "opt-in".



### Email Messages

- School newsletters and information about fundraising, hot lunch programs and other school activities will be shared via email.

### Additional Information

- Existing school-to-home communication tools currently used by classroom teachers (e.g. Seesaw, ClassDojo) may still be utilized.
- Schools will have flexibility in how they use SchoolMessenger. Stay tuned to your schools website and social media to learn more about how this new tool will be used at your child's school.
- All messages can also be viewed on the SchoolMessenger app. Parents are not required to download the app at this time, however, the Division will be asking all families to download the app when we move forward with the SchoolMessenger attendance reporting feature 'Safe Arrival'.
- Parents have the option to request that additional contacts, such as a child care provider, receive text and email messages from their child's school. Please call the school to make this request or if you have any questions about SchoolMessenger.



- If you did not receive the invitation text message or want to ensure you are registered, you can simply send a text message as follows:

# EXTREME WEATHER

## Is my child's bus running? Coming home early?



Throughout the winter, weather and road conditions are constantly monitored with the safety of students and staff at the center of all of our decisions. We strive to inform parents of any delays or cancellations as quickly as possible. Here's how you may be notified:

- Bus driver contact
- Call/text from your school
- Local radio stations
- Bus Status app

- Division social media (Facebook and Instagram)
- Division website
- <https://www.stpauleducation.ab.ca/transportation/bus-status>



When temperatures and/or wind chill is -40 or colder, buses are CANCELLED. Notice may be given the night before or in the morning.

### How we decide:

Weather checks start very early with The Weather Network and phone calls to designated staff living in each local area.

Even if buses are cancelled schools remain **OPEN**.

- If your child attends: meaningful learning still occurs
- If your child is absent: efforts will be made to ensure they do not fall behind

If a decision is required around temperature and/or road conditions, the Director of Transportation consults with:

- Local bus drivers
- School principals
- Superintendent of Schools

Parents always have the final say about their child's safety and well-being and can always choose whether or not to have their child take the bus.



- Decision is based on:
- Local road conditions
  - RCMP travel advisories
  - Weather and wind warnings
  - Local municipality

Your bus driver also has complete discretion to cancel a route should they feel travel is unsafe.



*The Nations of Saddle Lake, Whitefish Lake and Frog Lake make independent decisions about their buses. Please contact them directly for any questions regarding their transportation policies.*


